Dear Parishioners,

The schools in the Niagara Catholic system will fly the flag. The Director of Education justified it this way: “We believe in creating a culture of equity and inclusiveness in our schools by celebrating the richness and diversity of our students, staff, and our families.” The director’s language comes straight out of the Woke movement. “We believe in Jesus Christ” has been replaced by, “We believe in equity.” The language of faith is no accident, for the Woke ideology is a religion. Where did this new religion come from?!

The following is Part I (of III) on Cultural Marxism.*

The thesis of Dr. Lindsay is that Woke is an American-style version of Maoism, which in turn is a Chinese version of Marxism. Woke, therefore, is nothing other than American-style Marxism.

Marxism is a religion. We are told, deceitfully, it is only an economic system—but Marxism persecutes religions mercilessly. Why would an economic system need to do that? Karl Marx was not an economist. He wanted to create was a religion beyond all religions—and beyond private property.

Marx created an economic system because he thought he had to. He had concluded that, since society operated through the lens of private property, the Marx ideal would only be achieved by attacking or abolishing private property. The economics of his revolution were only a means to an end. The end was the religious transformation of man into his true socialist self.

This means of revolution actually worked in feudal societies, like Russia and China. The socialist paradise remains, however, decidedly illusive. This means did not work in capitalist countries. Here, the Marxists couldn’t convince the working-class proletariat to revolt—they were too prosperous and happy. The Marxists were forced to strategize. They realized they could keep the same general methodology but change the particulars.

The general method has 6 parts: A) A special form of property is identified, B) which segregates society into classes, C) into the haves (bourgeois) and the have-nots (proletariat). D) An ideology is used to support the exploitation of the have-nots. E) There’s a need to awaken the have-nots to revolt against the ideology, F) and to seize the means of production from the bourgeois. We will discuss these 6 parts in Part II.
